

Meeting was started with the address of the President **Prof. Sudhakar S.Mankar**. He welcomed all the office bearers present in the meeting and informed the house about the initiative taken by him regarding the formation of Retired University and College Teachers' Association at Pune and about his participation in the Annual conference of Puducherry University and College Teachers' Association. He also presented a brief picture of his participation in AIFUCTO Academic Conference held at Kurukshetra in March. He apprised the house his views regarding modifications in NEP-2020 and need of Uniform Pension Scheme across the country.

Afterwards **Prof. J. N. Shukla** General Secretary Presented his brief report. He expressed on the untimely demise of Prof O. Chaoba Devi, Zonal Secretary AIFRUCTO and Prof. Shambhu Nath Kundu Former Vice President Of AIFRUCTO and General Secretary WBCRTWA. (Annexure A) and Treasurer **Prof. S Bhattacharjeya** also presented a brief picture of pending dues. He told the house that many affiliated associations are not sending their dues regularly. He informed the house that after Gulbarga NEC around 26 life membership from Gulbarga, 50 life membership from Gujarat and 03 from Andhra Pradesh were received. He expressed thanks to Prof. Mahadev Desai for playing active role along with the leadership of Gujarat. He assured that audit for the year 2022-23 will be completed shortly. **Prof. Asok barman** a veteran teachers' leader and Patron AIFRUCTO addressed the meeting and

emphasized the need to strengthen the organization of retired teachers. He advised that we should associate more and more retired teachers in AIFRUCTO because they are asset for the society. They are educated, learned and active. Who can bring change in the society by educating and helping the deprived section of the society. **Prof. B. Parthasarathy**, former General Secretary and Patron of AIFRUCTO apprised the house about the latest situation of some of our pending demands and gave various suggestions for helping to those units which are yet deprived of pension. **Prof. Gopal Krishna Nanda**, a senior leader and National Secretary proposed the following resolutions before the house for approval.

1- Constitution of Editorial Board of AIFRUCTO NEWS MAGAZINE

2- Constitution of Life time achievement award to a veteran teachers' leader of the country every year. He Proposed the title of the award "Shikshak Sewa Ratna" He also proposed that the award for the year 2023 should be given to Prof Mrinmaya Bhattacharya a great teachers' leader, who needs no introduction.

3- He suggested the need of logo for AIFRUCTO

4- He also proposed a plan to meet out the grievances of RCT-AP by fixing a meeting with their leaders and visit Vijayawada along with General Secretary and National Secretaries Prof. Pullaiah and Prof. Keshavalu Reddy.

Prof. R.Ramchandrappa, National Secretary AIFRUCTO and General Secretary FUCRTAK apprised the developments in Karnataka i. e. revision of Pay Scales, 17% interim relief and about new D.A. order. We salute him for his efforts and achievements.

Prof. Pratip Mukherjee our National Secretary while reporting the situation of West Bengal informed the house that condition of West Bengal is precarious. In every corner of the education system corruption, bribery, illegal appointments have ransacked the sanctity of the system. Each and every democratic norms have been violated with the help of biased law enforcers and all the teachers of the state from KG to PG are being deprived of justice in all forms including payment of D.A. He further told that senior retired teachers are not getting minimum basic pension i. e. Rs 65700/.



Some honorable office bearers could not address the meeting due to network problem.

Meanwhile, a few of our old fighting friends have left this world, it is a great loss to their families, also a loss to the AIFRUCTO. In the last month Prof O. Chaoba Devi, our Zonal Secretary and Prof. Shambhu Nath Kundu Former Vice President of AIFRUCTO & General Secretary WBCURTWA passed away. Their demise is great loss for us. We express our deep condolences to the bereaved families.

Friends, let me briefly put before you a few facts with which all of you might be well aware of:

INTERNATIONAL SCENARIO

The war situation between Russia and Ukraine is becoming bitter day by day that has created panic all over the globe. As conscious citizen and responsible organization AIFRUCTO requests/appeals to all the powers in the globe of all the countries to create an atmosphere for the complete end of the war and war like situations. Unless the big powers in the world agreed to solve it, it may create disaster in the whole world. We appeal the Govt. of India also to play a positive role in settling this issue diplomatically with no loss. Also, we are aware about the critical situation prevailing in Afghanistan,

Pakistan, Sri Lanka and other countries. The Govt. of India can handle all these issues effectively and diplomatically without affecting our own interest.

Now, there is right time for us to link our Association to the International bodies like UNESCO for the purpose of information at the global level and also to contribute to the information to others.

NATIONAL SCENARIO

There are many issues that needs to be discussed. The steps adopted by the Govt. of India to implement the New Education Policy - 2020 is a matter of concern for all of us. We are part of the entire system. It is our duty to indicate the right steps to be followed for the future citizens of our country i.e. students and teachers and public at large. NEP needs to be rectified appropriately. Though other bodies have already raised their voices about it, we, AIFRUCTO, have also supported the cause in the possible way i.e. black badge protest is one of them.

The attempt to rewrite history of India by changing certain historical facts may create dissension among certain people. Changes if any may be brought after detailed deliberation with the intellectuals and the stakeholders. Such important developments are taking place in our national education policies have very important impact on our education across the country. We should discuss them in this and in future meetings.

Surprisingly, when some individuals are raising certain issues democratically, action is initiated in some cases.

ABOUT OUR DEMANDS:

AIFRUCTO have requested the Govt. of India to solve following problems of the retired University and College teachers across the country:

1. Medical Scheme for all University and College Teachers.
2. Uniform Pension Scheme for all retired University and College teachers in all States & Union Territories.
3. Implementation of 7th UGC pay scale and pension based on concordance table without any modification to all retired University and College teachers of all States & Union Territories.
4. Payment of additional quantum of pension i. e. 5% at 65 years, 10% at 70 years, 15% at 75 years and 20% at the age of 80 years.
5. Relief from income tax to all pensioners.
6. One notional increment to all teachers who retire on June 30.
7. Period of Commuted value of pension should be reduced from current 15 years to 10 years.
8. Senior pensioners of Universities and Colleges should be given the benefit of 20% of additional quantum of pension from the first day of the calendar month in which it falls due and not from the date of completion of 80 years of age.
9. Fixation of pension in Professor scale.

ORGANISATIONAL ISSUES

There are several problems of our retired College and University friends of different States which they are trying to solve at their end. AIFRUCTO is always with them at any point of time if our friends need suggestions, support etc.

Our Zonal Secretaries may speak about their zonal issues in consultation with their State / University level retired college teachers.

We have to start and also complete zonal level conferences preferably before our next academic conferences which may be held (if you agree) sometimes in October, November, 2023. All State and University level affiliated Associations may complete their annual meeting / conference by end of June 2023.

I invite proposals from all Units who can host or organize our next AIFRUCTO NEC sometimes between June and July, 2023.

I also invite proposals for hosting / organizing our next Annual Academic Conference of AIFRUCTO sometimes in October and November, 2023.

I will personally try to attend zonal and State level Association meetings or conferences if sufficiently informed or depute one of our office bearers well conversant with the problems of Pensioners.

Our friends of Andhra Pradesh (RCTA - AP) are unhappy with us. AIFRUCTO is their organization also. I request them not to refrain from the main stream, i. e. AIFRUCTO.

I am prepared to come to them to meet at any place they decide to discuss about the misunderstandings that has crippled. They are our veteran leaders, I request them again to re-join with us.


The treasurer will state briefly on financial position.

KARNATAKA STATE REPORT

The state Government formed a 7th pay commission which includes the enhancement of pension of retired UGC teachers. We are expecting about 30% enhancement. The state Government issued an order and implemented 17% interim benefit to all state government employees and pensioners.

The UGC teachers retired between 1.1.2006 and 31.12.2015 are getting a gross pension of Rs.10r285/- The teachers retired after 1.1.2016 (1.4.2019) are getting total pension of Rs.114456/-.

The teachers retired before to 1.1.2006 are getting much lesser pension. These teachers are attempted to get a basic pension of 23200 which is proposed in 2006 UGC pay scales, but state govt. never bothered to implement and instead issued an ordinance that the teachers are not supposed to claim any extra demand and whatever the govt. gives to the UGC teachers to be accepted. Even the teachers are not supposed to approach the court of law. However this ordinance is challenged in the court and we hope for the best.

Sub: Sanction of Dearness Allowance @ 4% enhancing the existing rate from 38% to 42% with effect from 01.01.2023 in favour of State Government Employees drawing pay in Revised Scale of Pay, 2017.

Government of India, Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure in their Office Memorandum No.1/1/2023-E-II(B), dt.03.04.2023 have enhanced Dearness Allowance payable to the Central Government Employees from existing 38% to 42% with effect from 01.01.2023.

2. Now, considering the overall financial resources and fiscal target stipulated under Odisha Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management Act, 2005, the State Government have been pleased to release the additional dose of D.A. @4% enhancing the same from the existing rate of 38% to 42% on the Basic pay with effect from 01.01.2023 in favour of State Government Employees, covered under the ORSP Rules, 2017.

3. This additional dose of D.A. @4% on the Basic pay with effect from 01.01.2023 and the manner of payment to the State Government employees as above is also applicable to the following category of employees covered under ORSP Rules, 2017.

- All India Service Officers serving in the affairs of the State Government for which GA & PG Department will issue Orders separately.
- Work-Charged Employees drawing in regular scale of pay under the ORSP Rules, 2017.
- Teaching & Non-Teaching staff of fully Aided Non-Government educational institutions those are covered under ORSP Rules, 2017.
- The Non-Teaching staff of Universities who are in receipt of regular scale of pay & covered under ORSP Rules, 2017 for whom the State Government is bearing full salary cost. These also include teachers of Universities who enjoy AICTE/UGC scale under ORSP (College Teachers) Rules, 2019

4. D.A. in accordance with this Memorandum will also be admissible to the State Government employees who were in service on 01.01.2023 but have ceased to be in service at the time of sanction of D.A. as per the revised scale of pay.

5. The Additional dose of D.A. will be drawn in the Pay Bill of June, 2023 and onwards. Arrear from the month of January, 2023 to May, 2023 on account of the enhanced D.A. shall not be drawn before the date of disbursement of salary of June, 2023.

6. The bill for drawal of D.A. as per revised scale of pay will be submitted to all Treasuries/Special Treasuries/Sub-Treasuries along with the pay bill for the month of June, 2023 and onwards.

7. The term "Basic Pay" in the revised pay structure means the pay drawn in the prescribed level in the Pay Matrix but does not include any other type of pay like Special Pay.

8. The payment on account of Dearness Allowance involving fractions of 50 paise and above may be rounded to the next higher rupee and the fractions of less than 50 paise may be ignored.

GOVERNMENT ORDER NO. FD 9 SRP 2023,

BANGALORE, DATED 30TH MAY 2023

Government are pleased to enhance the rates of Dearness Allowance payable to the State Government Employees in the 2018 Revised Pay Scales from the existing **31% to 35% of Basic Pay** with effect from **1st January 2023**.

2. For the purpose of this order, the term 'Basic Pay' means, pay drawn by a Government Employee in the scale of pay applicable to the post held by him and includes:

- Stagnation increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the scale of pay;
- Personal Pay, if any, granted to him under sub-rule (3) of Rule 7 read with Rule 3(c) of the Karnataka Civil Services (Revised Pay) Rules, 2018;
- Additional increment, if any, granted to him above the maximum of the scale of pay.

3. Basic Pay shall not include any emoluments other than those specified above.

4. Government are also pleased to enhance the rates of Dearness Allowance from the existing 31% to 35% of the Basic Pension/Family Pension with effect from 1st January 2023 to the State Government Pensioners/Family Pensioners as well as Pensioners/Family Pensioners of the Aided Educational Institutions whose Pension/Family Pension is paid out of the Consolidated Fund of the State.

5. These orders are also applicable to UGC/AICTE/ICAR Pensioners.

6. These orders will apply to the full time Government Employees, Employees of Zilla Panchayats, Work Charged Employees on regular time scales of pay, full time Employees of Aided Educational Institutions and Universities who are on regular time scales of pay.

7. Separate orders will be issued in respect of Employees on UGC/AICTE/ICAR/NJPC scales of pay and also in respect of NJPC Pensioners.


8. The increase in Dearness Allowance admissible under this order is payable in cash.

9. The payment on account of Dearness Allowance involving fractions of 50 paise and above shall be rounded off to the next rupee and fractions less than 50 paise shall be ignored.

10. The payment of arrears of Dearness Allowance shall not be made before the date of disbursement of salary for the month of May 2023.

11. The Dearness Allowance will be shown as a distinct element of remuneration and will not be treated as pay for any purpose.

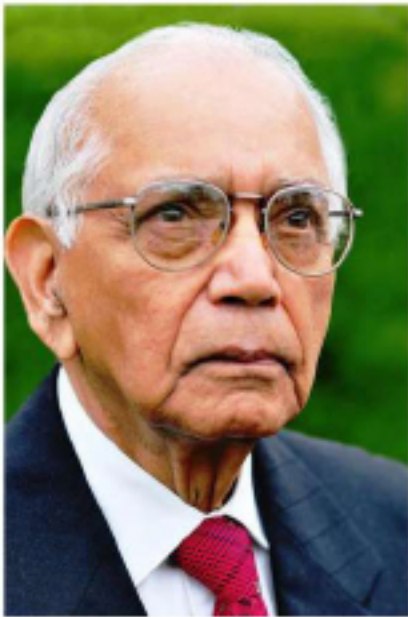

C.R.RAO

Calyampudi Ramakrishna Rao, commonly known as C.R.Rao was the eighth of the ten children born to a Telugu family in Hadagali, Bellary District, Karnataka on 10th December 1920. After his primary education in Andhra Pradesh He received an M.Sc., in Mathematics from Andhra University and an M.A., in Statistics from Calcutta University in 1943. He obtained a Ph.D. degree from King's College in Cambridge University in 1948 to which he added a D.Sc., degree also from Cambridge, in 1965.

C.R.Rao is an Indian-American mathematician and statistician. He is currently Professor emeritus at Pennsylvania State University and Research Professor at the University of Buffalo. Rao has been honored by numerous colloquia, honorary degrees and festschrifts and was awarded the US National Medal of Science in 2002. The American Statistical Association has described him as “ a living legend whose work has influenced not just statistics, but has had far reaching implications for fields as varied as economics, genetics, anthropology, geology, national planning, demography, biometry and medicine. In 2023, Rao was awarded the International prize in statistics an award often touted as the “Statistics’ equivalent to the Noble Prize”. Rao is also a Senior Policy and Statistics advisor for the Indian Heart Association non-profit focused on raising South Asian cardiovascular disease awareness.

Rao first worked at the Indian Statistical Institute and Anthropological Museum in Cambridge. Later He held several important positions, as the Director of the Indian Statistical Institute, Jawaharlal Nehru Professor at the University of Pittsburgh and Eberly Professor and Chair of Statistics and nation's highest award for lifetime achievement in fields of Director of the Center for Multivariate Analysis at Pennsylvania State University.

As Head and later Director of the Research and Training School at the Indian Statistical Institute for a period of over 40 years, Rao developed research and training programs and produced several leaders in the field of Mathematics. On the basis of Rao's recommendation, the Asian Statistical Institute (ASI) now known as Statistical Institute for Asia and Pacific was established in Tokyo to provide training to statisticians working in government and industrial organizations.

Among his best known discoveries are the Cramer-Rao bound and the Rao-Blackwell theorem both related the quality of estimators, Other areas he worked in include multivariate analysis, estimation theory and differential geometry. His other contributions include the Fisher -Rao theorem, Rao distance and orthogonal arrays. He is the author of 14 books and has published over 400 journal publications.

Rao has received 38 honorary doctoral degrees from Universities in 19 countries around the world and numerous awards and medals for his contributions to statistics and science. He is a member of eight National Academies in India, the United Kingdom, the United States, and Italy. Rao was awarded the United States National Medal of Science, that nation's highest award for lifetime achievement in fields of scientific research, in June 2002. He was given the India Science award in 2010, the highest honor conferred by the government of India in a scientific domain. In 2013, he was nominated for the noble Peace Prize, along with Miodrag Lovric (Editor) and Shlomo Sawilowsky, for their contribution to the International Encyclopedia of Statistical Science. He was most recently honored with his 38th honorary doctorate by the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur on 26th July 2014 for his contributions to the foundations of modern statistics through the introduction of concepts such as Cramer-Rao inequality, Rao-Blackwellization Rao distance, Rao measure, and for introducing the idea of orthogonal arrays for the industry to design high-quality products.

He was the President of the International Statistical Institute, Institute of Mathematical Statistics (USA), and the International Biometric Society. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame of India's National Institution for Quality and Reliability (Chennai Branch) for his contribution to industrial statistics and the promotion of quality control programs in industries.

The Journal of Quantitative Economics published a special issue in Rao's honor in 1991. " Dr.Rao is a very distinguished scientist and a highly eminent statistician of our time. His contributions to statistical theory and applications are well known, and many of his results, which bear his name, are included in the curriculum of courses in statistics at bachelor's level all over the world. He is an inspiring teacher and has guided the research work of numerous students in all area of statistics. His early work had greatly influenced the course of statistical research during the last four decades. The main purposes of publishing this article to recognize Rao's own contributions to econometrics and acknowledge his major role in the development of econometric research in India.
